"It's been an emotional struggle for me because I've never been in this situation," Nicole says.


Nicole's difficulties started when the temp agency she worked for no longer offered her enough work hours. Before long, what little money she earned wasn't enough to pay her rent.

days searching for somewhere she could stay and keep herself safe. She has Lupus and worried about her condition, especially in the midst of the pandemic.

Thankfully, Nicole heard about the Arlington Life Shelter. Since arriving, she's faithfully participating in the Shelter's employment and education program and is close to finding a new place to live.

"It's a needed program," she says. "With everything happening in the world right now, to be able to come to this place is amazing."

Nicole hopes to one day have her own business, helping other people with Lupus, and she's

working on the steps to make that possible. In the meantime, she's grateful for the simple things that you make possible every day.

"To be able to lay down and rest and get up the next day not to worry about what you're going to eat and where you're going to be – for people to provide that and not know the people they're helping, it's a real great thing."
