## You Brought Benjamin in From the Cold

Benjamin, 19, didn't have a job, identification, a home or anywhere else to turn when he happened upon the Arlington Life Shelter. Now, he's thanking you for turning all of that around, and more.

Benjamin says he walked for days without really knowing where he was going or how to get help. He slept on the streets until he discovered the Shelter.

"I saw [the Shelter] and stopped to see if they could help," he recalls. "I've been here for three months."

In that time, Benjamin says his case worker has helped him find a job and an apartment he'll move into soon.

"I've been working hard, and

they've helped me every step of the way," he says.

And though Benjamin says he didn't have a good home life and lost ties with his family, he has come to view fellow Shelter residents as his chosen family.

"Everyone is here to help each other," he says.

Benjamin says he's grateful to donors like you for making his stay possible and giving him the help he needed to make a fresh start. He even hopes to return to the Shelter to volunteer.

"With [your] help, I've been able to get a job and make myself a functional and active member of society," he says, proudly.

## You're Helping Jacob Dream Bigger



Jacob had only one goal in mind when he first arrived at the Arlington Life Shelter: finding a place to live. Now, his dreams are expanding thanks to the support of friends like you.

Jacob, 21, tells us he moved to the area with his dad, but began living in motels when they couldn't keep up with rent. That's when Jacob came to the Shelter while his dad moved in with friends.

"[The Shelter] gives you a straight line and what you can accomplish in a short period of time," Jacob says.

Jacob works for Republic Services and says Shelter staff have helped him learn how to set money aside for his future. Now, he's saved enough from his earnings to begin filling out apartment applications.

He says he's grateful he can focus on his future during his time at the Shelter.

"[The Shelter] provides the security of having somewhere to stay, not having to worry about where your next meal is going to come [from]," Jacob says.

Once Jacob has an apartment and transportation, he says he wants to consider further options for his future.

"Eventually, I'll get a laptop and get in school," he says. "That's a big one."

Jacob wanted to be sure you know how thankful he is for his time at the Shelter, and the fresh start you're helping give him.

"This helped me a lot," he says to donors like you. "I'm really grateful."

Arlington senior Yvonne is starting this new year with a new apartment and renewed hope for her future — and you are the first one she wants to thank for the gift of a second chance.
