## You Helped Rodney Overcome Adversity



Even the COVID-19 pandemic didn't stop Rodney, 58, from getting the help he needed to get back on his feet — and he's thanking you for making all that help possible.

"I am very grateful," Rodney savs of his stay at the Shelter. "It motivates me to keep going."

Rodney says he was sleeping in the back of his truck for months before making his way to the Arlington Life Shelter. Since arriving nearly two months ago, he says he has focused his time on finding a steady job.

Part of Rodney's time at the Shelter was actually spent in

a hotel. He originally tested negative for the COVID-19 virus but tested positive three days later.

"When I was sick, they put me in a nice hotel. But the people [at the hotel] are not the people [at the Shelter]...I actually missed this place."

Now, Rodney is back in good health and continues to focus on finding a job while also helping to take care of his 82-year old mother. He wants you to know how much he appreciates your help as he works to get back on his feet.

"You are awesome," he says to donors like you. "You truly make this Shelter what it is."

# You Bring Families Back Together

Eric and Josephine are thanking you for bringing their family back together and helping set them on a brighter path for their future.

After suffering some setbacks, the couple began living in a relative's vacant home and sent their children to live temporarily with their grandparents. But a severe storm caused more damage to the home, and they didn't have enough money for the repairs. Before long, they couldn't afford to keep the generator running, either.

That's when they began looking for another place to live. After discovering that many homeless shelters were

closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, they were especially relieved to find the Arlington Life Shelter.

"We could finally be with our children and in the same spot and somewhere safe while getting that needed help," Josephine says.

Now, Eric and Josephine are focused on finding employment and housing while maintaining stability for their family.

They're grateful for your support as they continue to work toward their goals and want you to know what a difference you're making for families like theirs.

"Thank you so much for everything," Josephine says. "[Thank you] for donating, for wanting to be a part of the Shelter and caring enough for our well-being."



## You're Helping Jordan Reach His Dreams

Jordan is starting this new year off with a set of goals he once thought weren't reachable. Thanks to friends like you, he now has the determination to see them through.

"I want to be able to further my education," Jordan says of a major goal he has been working on since arriving at the <u>Shelter</u>.

Jordan has been at the Shelter for a month now and says it has been much different than he expected.

"I had the feeling where I could finally relax," he says of the safety and comfort he felt after first arriving at the Shelter.

With that safe surrounding, Jordan says he has been busy working with staff and learning how to save money, budget and find affordable housing and transportation.

"I am working on growth while I'm here — self-discipline and goals I never thought I could reach," he says.

Ultimately, Jordan is also putting plans into place to study mechanical work and engineering.

"I think I would be good at it," he says confidently.

A big part of that confidence, Jordan says, comes from Shelter staff and donors like you who give him the encouragement and tools he needs to succeed.

"What [you] have done is so good for the people in need of



opportunities like this," he says to generous donors like you. "I am extremely grateful and thankful for [you]."
