Beatrice's Hard Work Pays Off

Beatrice Davis drives by the Arlington Life Shelter on her way to teach third grade social studies at Webb Elementary School. That was how three years ago, on her regular drive to work, she was inspired to turn a school lesson into a service project for her students.

The Earn, Save, Spend & Donate Program is a school-wide project for all subjects and grades. Beatrice sends a letter to parents asking them to assign chores and pay kids for their work. The students bring the money to school and Beatrice uses it to purchase muchneeded items for the Shelter, like toiletries and cleaning supplies.

"Every year, I look to make the program better than the year before," Beatrice says. "I want to make it better so that even more schools and communities can start a similar program."

One of these major improvements took place last year, when schools shut down because of the pandemic. The program's website added a donation link and raised an incredible \$7,000!

"Everyone should get excited to help the community in some way or another," Beatrice shares. "The community is so touched by what we do and that keeps us going." Thank you for all your hard work, Beatrice. You, your students and the Webb family are making a huge difference in countless lives.

During their first three days in Texas, Ladonna, Xavier (14), Tristan (5) and Tyler (3) slept in a broken-down car. They had no family or friends nearby.

When Ladonna heard about the <u>Arlington Life Shelter</u> and

was welcomed with open arms, she felt blessed beyond belief.

"It's a step up from sleeping in a car," Ladonna says.


With assistance from the Shelter, Ladonna is planning to earn her GED as well as her driver's license. And she also wants to find a house for her and her boys!
