When Diamond lost both of her jobs in the midst of

the COVID-19 pandemic, she says she was relieved to find a helping hand for her and her 4-year-old daughter thanks to your generosity.

"My first week here I was in the mindset, 'try not to rely on [staff] help'" Diamond says. "But then I realized they are really helpful, and it was needed."

And while Diamond works to get back on her feet, she especially wants to thank you for helping give her and her needed.

"Thank you so much," she says. "Thank you for caring like vou do."

# Karin Honors Son by Serving Neighbors



"Before you do for yourself, you see what others need."

It's with that motto in mind, and the memory of her late son, Scott, that Karin Farris, 74, has made volunteer service at the Arlington Life Shelter a regular part of her life in the last couple of years.

Karin makes it a habit to call the Shelter to see what items are necessities to the Shelter, but needed, and she typically finds a way to bring those items within a couple of days' time.

"I take it as a challenge, I ask, 'What do you need?'" She laughed as she remembered, "I went to five different stores looking for thermal underwear right before a predicted snowstorm."

But for Karin, it's all a part of honoring Scott, who served as a volunteer and supporter of the Shelter before his death.

She not only brings also treats to brighten guests' days, like special holidaythemed bags for Halloween

and Valentine's Day. Karin also loves that Shelter guests are treated with dignity.

"It's not just a Shelter to spend the night and get some food. It's a new start. It's a Life Shelter."

"I feel better here," he says.

Since arriving, Christian says staff have helped him work on getting an ID again, which will allow him to start looking for new work. Once that's is in place, he hopes to find an apartment and buy another car.

And since coming to the Shelter, Christian is also inspired to do even more with his future.

"When I start making money again, I'm going to start helping people too," he says. Thank you for not only giving neighbors like Christian the tools they need to start over again, but for inspiring them to pay it forward. Shelter guests like Christian are so grateful for you.
